

SEVERN RIVER TROPHY WINNER 2012 - Judy Hook Smith

(excerpts from speech presented by Linda Wood at the 2012 Annual Meeting)

The Severn River Trophy is awarded each year at our Annual Meeting, the recipient having been selected by the three previous recipients. This year that group included Buzzy Hall, Dick and Susan Whiteford and Eddie Wood.

This majority of the explanation of this award was taken from the October, 1979 Green Sheet and was written by Robyn Jones – Eddie felt he couldn't have said it better.

This trophy was first presented by the Severn River Association in 1936 to the Sherwood Forest Community with William Cochrane, our founder, accepting. The award was made in recognition of his "foresight, initiative and ability in making possible this unique and outstanding community. Over the past 76 years this honor has been given each year to men and women who have continued to make Sherwood Forest that unique and outstanding community. We honor another tonight.

Sherwood is rich in tradition – tradition based on high ideals. We have existed and prospered because of that tradition. Mr. Cochrane started us out with strict guidelines and by adhering to them year after year, generation after generation, we have remained unique, keeping intact an atmosphere favorable to warm family relations and lasting friendships while retaining the beauty of the Forest.

We are privileged this year to have the "oldest living recipient of the Severn River Trophy" with us tonight. He stood in for Eddie on the 4th of July and he would like him to stand in one more time. Dick Hook, could you please join me up here and present the award to the 2012 Severn River Trophy Honoree.

It might be easier to tell you what Judy has not done. No evidence exists that she played Duplicate Bridge. However, she did just about everything else since coming to Sherwood in 1953 with her parents, Dick and Betty and her siblings, Rick, Bruce, Neville and Bill.

A 1965 Green Sheet says, "Judy Hook and Pete Smith will be married this Saturday, August 21, at the Cathedral of Mary Our Queen in Baltimore. Judy and Pete have both gone through the Boys and Girls Club and have both served as counselors for a number of years. Judy has been Playground Director this year and was Girl of the Year in 1959. Another Sherwood romance!"

Sherwood summers were always part of her life and in 1979 she and Pete bought Cottage 520 on Little John, spent their summers here with their children, Peter, Stacy, Eric and Katie following in their footsteps with the Club program. Along the way she did it all –

- Member of the Board of Directors and served as Vice President
- Chaired and served on the Activities Board
- Participated and chaired Ladies Monday Golf as well as an annual contender in the Club Championships
- Played twice and helped with the Pro-AM
- Involved in the Tennis program and was treasurer for many years.
- Stepped in again as a counselor on Adult Camp Day
- Rounded up the volunteers to cook and serve hamburgers at the Corn Roast for too many years to count
- She and Pete were chairmen of the 4th of July
- Served on the Nominating Committee,
 Pool Committee, Parents Committee,
 Limited Membership Committee,
 Clubhouse Committee, had a brief
 bowling career and spearheaded the
 restoration of the Clubhouse restrooms,
 funding the project by making a poster
 of a Sherwood aerial picture which she
 took.

...And probably attended and supported every Sherwood function along the way.

THE SHERWOOD FOREST POST OFFICE NOW HAS A NEW STAMP CAPABILITY

The Sherwood Forest post office is a privately administered Contract Postal Unit (CPU), not a branch of the US Postal Service (USPS), but is under their supervision. The USPS limits our CPU to carry only a small amount of stamps at a time, and we formerly had restrictions on the number of times we could order new stamps. However, the USPS has contacted us recently and would like to see us increase revenue. The only way to increase the amount of stamps the USPS will allow us to have on hand is to consistently increase our revenues from stamp sales. This has been difficult in the past since we were limited by the USPS in how often we could replenish our supply of stamps. It hindered our ability to re-stock quickly after stamps have been sold out.

The US Postal Service (USPS) has now lifted some of the restrictions that have prevented us from ordering stamps to sell. We now have the ability to order stamps when needed, within our same allowance, instead of having to wait one month to re-order, and we are now allowed to carry rolls of 100 stamps.

We are encouraging Members to buy as many stamps as possible from our post office. Members—if you have a business that needs stamps, please consider purchasing them from our Post Office. Let us know what your stamp needs are, and we will do our best to accommodate your request by ordering the stamps you need, within our USPS allowances. Forms of payment are checks and cash (no credit cards).

The holidays will be here before we know it. Please let our post office know at least a week in advance how many stamps you would like for your Christmas card mailing needs.

Please be aware that our post office—just the same as regular US Post Office branches—can run out of stamps from time to time. However, we now have the ability to re-stock more quickly than before, and if we don't have what you need on a given day, we can order it for pickup later. It now takes approximately <u>one week</u> from the time we order stamps to the time we receive them.

We appreciate your patience as we work through this new ordering system, and seek to increase the inventory of stamps we are allowed to carry.

BUILDING PROJECTS

The construction moratorium is in effect every year beginning on June 15th and continuing through Labor Day, inclusive, therefore, work on **approved** building projects may not begin until September 4, 2012. No work is to be done during the moratorium and contractors are not permitted in the Forest.

If you need to submit a building application, Allow <u>at least 30 days</u> for the building application approval process.
