2016 SUMMER OLYMPICS & SHERWOOD

The 2016 Summer Olympics begins today, August 5th, in Rio de Janeiro. Two Sherwood athletes will be participating, Joseph Morris and Elena Delle Donne (Sixbey). TV coverage will be provided by NBC.

Joseph Morris, Sailing

Son of Joe & Jeanne Morris he began sailing on the Severn River and raced everything from lasers, 420s, 505s, 470s, 29ers, to J22s. He is a graduate of Severn School & Yale University where he was a: 5 time National Champion, 4 time ICSA Collegiate All-American, 3 time 420 World Team Member, 2 time Yale Sailing Team Captain, and NEISA Sailor of Year

Joseph will be sailing a "49er" at the Rio games. A 49er is a two-handed [skiff-type](#) high-performance [sailing dinghy](#). This class of boat made its Olympic debut at the 2000 Sydney Olympics. USA has medaled only once, a bronze in the Sydney Games. Joseph will be sailing with his college classmate Thomas Barrows.

Elena Delle Donne, Basketball

Daughter of Ernie & Joanie Delle Donne (Sixbey), granddaughter of Dan & Betsy Sixbey. Following her storied high school and collegiate career, Elena was selected second overall in the [2013 WNBA Draft](#) by the [Chicago Sky](#). She led all players in votes for the [2013 WNBA All-Star Game](#), the first time a rookie has done so in WNBA history. Elena was the 2013 WNBA Rookie of the Year.

On September 16, 2015, Delle Donne was named the WNBA MVP for the 2015 season. She scored a league-high 23.4 points per game, shot 95% from the free throw line and came in third in rebounding. She received 38 of 39 first place votes.

Other Sherwood Olympians

Sherwood has produced 5 Olympic athletes. The other 3 are:

Shelly Mann, Swimming

Daughter of Hamilton and Isabel Mann. Shelly was an Olympic medalist at the 1956 Summer Olympics in Melbourne where she won the gold medal in the women's 100-meter butterfly event, and was a member of the runner-

up U.S. team that won the silver medal for the women's 4×100-meter freestyle relay.

Two years after taking up competitive swimming at the age of 12, Shelly Mann won the first of her 24 AAU titles. She won national championships in the freestyle, breaststroke, butterfly and individual medley events. At the 1955 Pan American Games she won bronze in the 100 m butterfly. She equaled the world record for the 100 m freestyle.

Bill Logan, Lacrosse

Father of Anne Logan Wilson and former Club & Company Manager. Bill played on the US lacrosse team in the 1928 Olympics in Amsterdam. In 1928, lacrosse as an Olympic demonstration sport with the US team finishing in first place.

Upon his return he became the varsity head coach at Baltimore City College. In 1930 he became coach of the Princeton soccer and lacrosse team. While coaching lacrosse he too was the head coach of Princeton's basketball team from 1942 – 1944. During these years Princeton was ranked in the top 4 teams nationally. In 1945, Logan returned to his alma mater, Johns Hopkins, as Director of Admissions. On the side, he assisted in the coaching of freshmen and varsity lacrosse. In 1959, Logan resigned from Hopkins to become Club Manager of Sherwood. He was inducted into the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 1969.

Moke Merriken, Lacrosse

James "Moke" Merriken played on the US lacrosse team in the 1932 Summer Olympics held in Los Angeles. In 1932, lacrosse was an Olympic demonstration sport with the US team finishing in first place.

Moke was a graduate of Friends School and Johns Hopkins University. He was the captain of the Hopkins lacrosse team in 1933 and a member of Phi Gamma Delta fraternity.

Our thoughts, and prayers, and very best to both Joseph & Elena as they compete in the world's foremost sports competition.

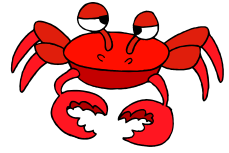
